What's on this half term?

History

Children will learn about the key events of the Battle of Hastings. They will also learn about similarities and differences between types of castles.

Art

Children will explore Paul Klee's abstract art, thinking about the shapes and colours used. They will work towards creating their own piece of art work using watercolours.

Science

Children will learn that living things live in different habitats and which living things live in which habitats.

Children will use the repeated phrases in Zog to help them to retell and add their own ideas to the story.

Children will retell the classic story before reading a twist on the tale.

Supporting your child at home

Reading - we ask that children read 4x per week and that this is recorded in their reading challenge. Reading challenges are expected to be in school every day.

Spellings - We really appreciate your support in helping your child to learn their weekly spellings. They will be tested each Friday.

Numbots - Regular practise helps with many areas of the Key Stage One maths curriculum.
