What's on this half term?

Benin Kingdom (Art and History)

Children have had enormous fun developing their artistic skills and learning to manipulate clay in order to recreate the famous Benin bronzes. In history, they are learning about the rise and fall of the Benin Kingdom and will be considering the significance of various aspects of their civilisation (for example, trade, war and social structure).

Properties of materials (Science)

In this physics unit, children are learning to group materials based on their properties and understand how this affects their use. They will explore reversible and irreversible changes, for example dissolving and evaporation.

<u>English</u>

<u>Maths</u>

Children will:

- Find the area, perimeter and volume of shapes.
- Use a protractor to measure angles.
- Recognise acute, obtuse and reflex angles.
- Calculate missing angles on a straight line and around a point
- Understand the properties of 2D and 3D shapes
- Interpret information from graphs, tables and timetables

TTRS - Regular times table practise helps with many areas of the Upper Junior maths curriculum. We encourage children to complete 10 garage sessions per week.

If a child is unable to complete homework tasks at home, they will be invited to a lunch time catch up club.
