Poor Parkers to be Named and Shamed

There have been several potentially serious incidents recently, one resulting in the road being blocked by an unreasonable driver which caused mayhem, including the substantial delay of a secondary school bus causing many families concern and inconvenience.



After Easter, registration details of inconsiderate parking will be published in the weekly school newsletter. If a number plate is recorded three times, the details will be passed to Hampshire Police for further action.

Housing Development

Work will commence on the new houses opposite the church in the coming weeks. This will no doubt cause increased pressure on our already busy road and we ask that parents leave more time in getting to school and remain calm and patient for the duration of the construction.



Junior Road Safety Officers

New Forest District Council will paint additional yellow lines on Hordle Lane opposite the school after Easter. This is designed to alleviate the congestion outside the school and make the roads **safer for everyone**.

This is a national awards scheme which recognises schools who take the initiative in supporting walking, cycling and other forms of sustainable travel.
