Basil launches new Park and Stride map!

Basil the Hampshire County Council Road Safety mascot visited the school at the end of June to launch the new Park and Stride map.

Basil took part in an awesome road safety assembly delivered by the JRSO (Junior Road Safety Officer) Team of pupils and then at the end of the school day he waved off the pupils with copies of the new Park and Stride Map.

The map is part of the School Travel Plan team's latest initiative to encourage parents who usually drive to school to park a little further away and walk the remaining 10 minutes into school. It shows alternative locations and walking routes to the Ofsted Outstanding-rated primary school. Basil said afterwards:

"This scheme has lots of benefits. Parking a bit further from school helps the children stay physically and mentally healthy with the extra exercise from the walk and is much less stressful for parents and carers as it eases traffic congestion and all the hassle associated with that. It really is a great way to get to and from school everyday for everyone".
