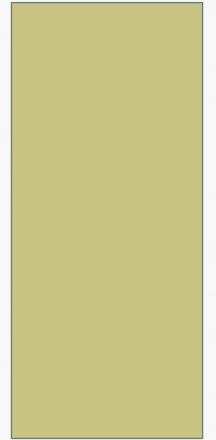

NUMBER ELG

Children count reliably with numbers from 1 to 20, place them in order and say which number is one more or one less than a given number. Using quantities and objects, they add and subtract two single-digit numbers and count on or back to find the answer. They solve problems, including doubling, halving and sharing.

NUMBER ELG - HELPING AT HOME

- Recognising numbers 0-20
- Ordering numbers 0-20
- Sharing an amount between 2 or 3 people

READING ELG

Children read and understand simple sentences. They use phonic knowledge to decode regular words and read them aloud accurately. They also read some common irregular words. They demonstrate understanding when talking with others about what they have read.

READING ELG - HELPING AT HOME

WRITING ELG

Children use their phonic knowledge to write words in ways which match their spoken sounds. They also write some irregular common words. They write simple sentences which can be read by themselves and others. Some words are spelt correctly and others are phonetically plausible.

WRITING ELG - HELPING AT HOME

- Cursive vs Non-Cursive
- Hold a sentence orally before being able to write
- Construction of sentences
