## Topic - Dinosaurs

For the first two weeks after half-term the children will be learning all about dinosaurs. This is a very exciting topic and we are really looking forward to it.

**Harry and the Dinosaurs:** We will be looking at and sharing the books from the Harry and the Dinosaur series, exploring the settings and the different characters. We will then plan and write our own version of a dinosaur adventure.

**The Dirty Great Dinosaur:** We will be learning about dinosaurs, looking at how they lived a long time ago and are now extinct. We will then read stories where dinosaurs come back to life, thinking about what it would be like to have these huge animals roaming around with us now.

During our Dinosaur topic we will also be making dinosaurs using split pins, painting dinosaur silhouettes and using all sorts of exciting materials to build dinosaur lands. We will also be using the computer to learn about some interesting dinosaur facts.
