

Parking at Nursery Close

Here is a message to all parents and carers, from Satti Kandola, Property Manager, the Hyde Group:

‘We have been made aware of several issues with parking in Nursery Close during school run hours. We would like to make all parents and families aware that Nursery Close is a private estate and parking is permitted for residents and their visitors only. We will be introducing parking enforcement controls from **Monday 18 March**. Please refrain from parking in this close as non-permit holders will be issued with a penalty charge notice. We would like to thank you for your cooperation.’

Also, unfortunately, there are still a few people parking on the yellow zig zags in front of the school, despite the large banners on the school fence and regular appeals in this newsletter. We would like to remind these select few that not only is this inconsiderate and selfish but it is also very dangerous for everyone else’s children. Following an incident this term, we would like remind all parents if you see anyone pulled up on the zig zags please do not take matters into your own hands and approach the offender – just take a photograph of the car showing its registration plate and email it to: stphordleprimary@gmail.com. Save the email as a contact in your phone for ease of reference. After being photographed ONCE on the zig zags, the car details will be reported to the Police for further action. If a car is photographed parking on the double yellow lines 3 TIMES, details will be passed to the Police.
