

Pupil Premium 2015 - 2016

Funding received

For 2015-2016 we received £63,360 in Pupil Premium (48 pupils).

How the funding is being spent

Many of the strategies that we will be implementing are recommended in the EEF toolkit (<https://educationendowmentfoundation.org.uk/toolkit/toolkit-a-z/>) and/or have been identified by the school as areas of need:

Strategy	How the funding will be spent
Pupil Premium Champion – closing the gap in attainment and attendance	Employment of Pupil Premium Champion who will support all staff in developing awareness of their P.P. children; monitoring academic performance and attendance and communicating findings to all staff and governors, putting into place plans of action where required. Attendance In 2014/15 PP boys attendance was better than non-PP therefore the gap was purely due to PP girls attendance – the attendance of PP girls will be a particular focus. Attainment 2015 KS2 SATs results show that PP pupils do not achieve as well as non-PP in higher level writing therefore this will also be a focus.
Early Years intervention	Top heavy staffing
Attendance team	A group of senior leaders, SENCO and PP Champion will meet regularly and monitor/work closely with families whose children fell into the persistent absentee category in 14/15 as well as PP girls (see above).
Higher level writers	Staff to receive training from a Hants English adviser with a particular focus on developing higher level PP writers
Mastery in Maths	Singapore Maths staff training
Social and Emotional Learning	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Key member of staff to administrate the organisation of our Grandhordles (senior members of our community) who work alongside pupils on a 1:1 or small group basis to support them in engaging with their learning and building their self-esteem ELSAs to work with our most vulnerable pupils in both 1:1 and small group situations
Oral language interventions to improve outcomes in writing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Staff training on developing the oral curriculum through debate and reciprocal reading SALT– FS and targeted intervention for PP children
Parent Partnership	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Provision of parent workshops delivered by ReCap focusing on the parent/child relationship, parenting tools for managing behaviour/anxieties and more Provision of staff training delivered by ReCap with a focus on understanding children's emotional needs, specifically worries, anxieties and managing anger Cost of pyramid parent support worker (coordinates hampers, summer schools etc)
Homework	Free Homework Club pass for FSM pupils, attendance and outcomes/impact monitored by PP Champion
Arts/Sports participation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All FSM pupils will receive a voucher for an after school club of their choice as well a subsidised music tuition The PP Champion will ensure FSM children are supported in joining an after school club; meeting with parents and supporting families as needs arise
School uniform	All FSM pupils will receive a school sweatshirt and school PE kit
Teaching assistants	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> At least 2 TAs in each phase in the afternoons to deliver planned and dynamic interventions for individuals and small groups
