Target Substantially achieved - we were delighted to report to the Governors that all pupils participated in a multi skills festival run by the New Forest Sports partnership and external virtual competitions against other schools in the New Forest due to being unable to meet face to face due to Covid. 2 - To improve class level competitive sport apportunities - Target achieved - These are now embedded in the PE provision across the school for example undertaking a newly designed sports day with all children competing in a wide range of events. Additionally, 60 children across KS1 and KS2 took part in sports leader training which will continue next year. 3 - Developed a tiered approach to school Sports Ambassadorship and other leadership opportunities. Achieved - now requires further development and embedding 4 - To achieve the Platinum School Games Mark Due to Covid all schools were given an extension of their sports mark for a year, therefore, Hordle has retained its platinum mark. Throughout next academic year, we will work to maintain the mark. 5 - Y6 Swimming Due to Covid, swimming was unable to take place, however, we have identified which children in the UJ are unable to swim 25m and therefore require catch up swimming lessons this academic year. Additionally, we are planning for all LJ to undertake swimming lessons as planned.
