Pre-historic	Before records began
archaeologist	A person who studies human history through looking at artefacts and other remains.
Hunter gatherer	Someone who hunts animals and gathers their food to eat.
Flint	A very hard stone that can produce a spark when struck by another stone.
Wattle and daub	Mixture of animal dung, clay and straw. .
Hillfort	A defended settlement on built on hill tops.
Bronze	Metal made from copper and tin to make it harder and more durable.
Iron	Comes in a variety of forms and is made from iron ore.

Very Important Places

Stonehenge

Located: Salisbury Plain, Wiltshire



What is it?: Huge man made circle of standing stones.

Built: Started to built during the Stone Age and was finished during the Bronze Age.

Purpose: Historians are not 100% sure but believe it could have been used as a calendar, a place of healing or a religious site.



Very Important Places

Skara Brae:

Located: Orkney Islands off the North of Scotland.



What is it?:

One of Britain's best preserved pre-historic villages.

Discovered: 1850 following a huge storm hitting the island and blowing all the sand, earth and plants away exposing the village.

Purpose: village of hunters, fisherman and farmer.
