Accommodation

- Eco-Dormitory beautiful timber framed building with solar heating and rainwater capture
- Teacher bedrooms closely linked to both dormitories
- Security all cabins locked (Yale lock)
- Bunk beds
- Modern washrooms in each dormitory
- Single gender dormitories one for girls and one for boys
- The Bean Bag Room for evening relaxation
- Energy display showing the children's daily energy and water use.







Meal Times

- Mindful not be wasteful
- Home grown food
- Table manners

Dietary requirements made known to kitchen staff

Cooked breakfast

Lunch – choice of sandwiches, fruit and cake

- Dinner main meal and pudding
- Pre-bed supper of milk and biscuits



Explanation of Costings

Zone A (4th – 8th Sept, 27th Nov – 19th Jan)	120
Zone B (11th Sept – 24th Nov, 22nd Jan – 9th Feb)	141
Zone C (19th Feb – 28 th March)	150
Zone D (15th April – 23 rd July)	166
